THE WORLD FORUM 2026: to join a roundtable discussion on **SAVE TAIWAN at The World Forum on the Future of Democracy, AI/Tech and Humankind** on 16 & 17 February, alongside global leaders such as a US President, Honorary Chairwoman of The World Forum Secretary Hillary Clinton, heads of state, Nobel laureates and scientists and also speak at a panel discussion on **"Taiwan, Ukraine and Nations Under Threat - Why Protect Democracy?"** and constitute **SAVE TAIWAN - Inter-Parliamentary Alliance on Taiwan (SIPAT)**.

The World Forum proposes the establishment of **SAVE TAIWAN - Inter-Parliamentary Alliance on Taiwan (SIPAT)**. The primary objective of SIPAT is to provide an internationally recognized platform that unites lawmakers from across the globe in support of Taiwan. IPAT members will collaborate to develop coordinated divestment strategies, enact sanctions, and implement supportive legislation; to reach consensus on a collective trigger mechanism that would activate joint responses if China initiates military action against Taiwan.

We offer discussing a new approach to the **"One China policy"**, respecting China's interests while supporting Taiwan's inclusion in the international community and discussing the development of **The Alliance of Democratic Nations which could enable the G7 and an extended NATO - including Japan, India, Taiwan, Philippines, South Korea, Australia - to create a new world order and lead and protect the world with democratic values**. With predictions of a possible Chinese invasion of Taiwan, urgent diplomatic protection mechanisms like divestment, trade, and sanctions laws with US and EU involvement are needed to deter aggression.

2. CINEMA FOR PEACE & DEMOCRACY GALA on 16th February: attend the Cinema for Peace & Democracy Gala which presents **"The Noble Prize"** for **"Guardians of Democracy"**, **"The Man of the Year"** & **"The Woman of the Year"** and **"Cinema for Peace Award"** for **"The Most Valuable Films of the Year"** presented by Sir Bob Geldof.

The World Forum 2025, in Berlin fostered new solutions for the pressing issues of our time, from the rapid advancement of AI technology to the global democratic recession - with contributions by Pope Francis, US President Bill Clinton, Secretary Hillary Clinton, President of Taiwan Lai Ching-te, and many further Heads of State, Nobel Peace Laureates Maria Ressa, Oleksandra Mathviichuk and Narges Mohammadi (from Iranian prison), the potential "President of Russia in-exile" Vladimir Kara-Murza, and the world's leading scientist on longevity Professor David Sinclair on how to stop aging and extend human lifespan. Among the 200 speakers at The World Forum's 40 panel discussions were some of the world's leading minds in their fields such as the ethicist Peter Singer, and the former President of the Hungarian Supreme Court András Baka, who analysed the division of powers as the foundation of democracy. 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GUIDELINES FOR LAWMAKERS ON TAIWAN AND CHINA

The panel "Taiwan, Ukraine, and Nations Under Threat: How to Protect Democracy?" took place at **The World Forum 2025 in Berlin**, bringing together members of parliament from leading democracies - including Germany, the UK, Sweden, Ireland, Lithuania, and New Zealand - alongside senior diplomats, military experts, and human rights advocates. The discussion placed particular emphasis on Taiwan as a frontline democracy facing rising authoritarian pressure from China; it is imperative for democratic nations to play a key role in strengthening Taiwan's international standing and resilience. Here are ten specific actions that governments can take to support Taiwan's recognition as a fully sovereign and independent democracy:

- 1. Upgrade Diplomatic Representation:** Convert TECRO offices to "Taiwan Representative Offices" or "Taiwan Embassies" to affirm Taiwan's sovereignty and distinct identity.
- 2. Remove Travel Restrictions on Taiwanese Leaders:** Lift bans that restrict Taiwan's President and senior officials from visiting capital cities or engaging in official dialogues.
- 3. Ensure Freedom of Navigation in the Taiwan Strait:** Support routine transits by allied naval vessels through the Strait to reinforce its status as international waters and counteract Chinese territorial assertions. Additionally, address the issue of Chinese vessels severing undersea communication cables, making it clear that further sabotage will incur substantial economic penalties and sanctions.
- 4. Clarify UN Resolution 2758:** Clearly state that the resolution only removed Chiang Kai-shek's representatives and did not address Taiwan's status or representation. Encourage more nations to recognize that UN Resolution 2758 does not label Taiwan as part of China, as this resolution is commonly used by China to justify its One China Policy, falsely incorporating Taiwan.
- 5. Redefine the "One China" Policy:** Clarify that each country's "One China Policy" is separate from Beijing's interpretation. Acknowledge the coexistence of one China and one Taiwan, and distinguish between acknowledging and accepting Beijing's stance on Taiwan. Highlight the 1952 San Francisco Peace Treaty, noting that Japan renounced sovereignty over Taiwan without specifying a transfer to China, thus the future of Taiwan should be determined by its people.
- 6. Support Taiwan's Name in International Forums:** Advocate for Taiwan to be represented under its own name, such as "Taiwan Republic" or "Republic of Taiwan," rather than "Chinese Taipei" or "Taiwan, Province of China," in international events and organizations.
- 7. Enhance Taiwan's Security:** Promote bilateral or multilateral agreements to enhance Taiwan's defense capabilities, including arms sales and military training. Note the strategic importance of Taiwan's semiconductor industry, led by TSMC, which is critical to global high-tech markets. Any disruptions to its operations could lead to significant global economic repercussions.
- 8. Advocate for Taiwan in Global Organizations:** Actively support Taiwan's inclusion in the WHO, ICAO, INTERPOL, and other significant international bodies and the UN.
- 9. Promote Economic Integration:** Negotiate free trade agreements and support Taiwan's admission into regional trading blocs like the CPTPP and IPEF.
- 10. Signal Consequences for Aggression:** Coordinate with allies to declare that any military aggression against Taiwan will result in severe diplomatic and economic sanctions. Emphasize a collective deterrent message: "Any invasion or blockade of Taiwan will trigger its immediate recognition as a sovereign nation with full diplomatic privileges."

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"WHY WE MUST PROTECT TAIWAN & THE CHIPS - to avoid THE BIGGEST WORLD ECONOMIC CRISIS EVER and CHINA TAKING OVER THE WORLD"

TSMC alone is worth more to global stability than most countries' entire economies. The 17 million wafers they produce annually are the invisible infrastructure of modern civilization. Prevention is infinitely cheaper than cure. Every dollar spent on deterrence and supply chain diversification today saves \$100 in crisis response tomorrow.

What Would Happen If China Invades Taiwan: The Semiconductor Catastrophe

Immediate Impact: The immediate impact of a global chip shutdown would be profound, with TSMC playing a critical role by producing 17 million wafers annually and commanding about 65-70% of the global foundry market. It manufactures chips for NVIDIA, AMD, Qualcomm, Apple, and hundreds of other companies, controlling over 90% of advanced chips (7nm and below). With \$73.7 billion in annual revenue and \$35.3 billion in profit, TSMC's production halt during the first week would severely disrupt the global semiconductor supply chain.

Instant Consequences: If all TSMC fabs shut down or become inaccessible, it would halt production for major clients: NVIDIA loses its sole AI GPU supplier, risking \$60.92B in revenue; AMD's CPU/GPU output stops, affecting \$25.78B; Apple's A-series and M-series chip production stops; and Qualcomm's Snapdragon chip manufacturing ceases, impacting \$38.96B in revenue. This would cause severe disruptions across the global tech industry. Between weeks 2 and 4, cascade failures would halt key industries: automotive production stops as modern cars require 1,000-3,000 chips; smartphone output falls by 90%, affecting major models like iPhone, Samsung Galaxy and etc; data centers cease new AI server deployments; consumer electronics such as laptops, gaming consoles, and TVs face shutdowns; 5G telecom infrastructure buildout halts; and medical device production completely stops. These impacts showcase the widespread industrial paralysis caused by chip shortages.

Economic Shockwave: The shutdown would cause an immediate \$1-2 trillion global economic loss, trigger a crash in the tech sector's stock markets, and lead to panic buying in supply chains for existing inventory. During the first three months, chip rationing would prioritize military and defense systems, critical infrastructure such as power grids, water, and communications, medical devices, and essential services, while all other sectors compete for limited supply.

Priority Allocation (Government Control and Consumer impact): In a semiconductor crisis, chip supply would be prioritized under government control. Military and defense systems would receive top priority, followed by critical infrastructure sectors like power grids, water, and communications. Medical devices and essential services would also be prioritized to maintain safety and functionality. All other sectors would compete for the remaining limited chip supply, often ending up with only scraps. This allocation reflects the strategic importance of semiconductors in national security and critical services. Shortage of semiconductors would include smartphone prices doubling or tripling due to limited existing inventory. New car production could drop by 60-80%, while PC and laptop prices might surge by 3 to 5 times. Gaming consoles would become unavailable, and home appliances reliant on chips would also disappear from the market. This reflects widespread product scarcity and price inflation driven by supply constraints.

The ASML Problem: ASML, a key supplier of lithography systems for chip production, sells around 380 machines annually worth approximately €28.26 billion. In the event of a Taiwan crisis, many of these systems in Taiwan would become inaccessible or destroyed, stalling global semiconductor fab expansion plans as there would be no equipment available for new fabs. With lead times of 3-5 years for new lithography machines, replacement cannot happen quickly. Meanwhile, Samsung's foundry capacity of about 7-8 million wafers per year is already over 90% utilized and could only absorb 10-15% of TSMC's customers. Samsung also faces geopolitical risks from neighboring North Korea and China, limiting its ability to fully compensate for TSMC's disruption.

Intel (United States), Global Foundries, UMC, SMIC and others: Intel has a foundry capacity of about 2-3 million wafers per year but is years behind in advanced semiconductor node technology. It cannot manufacture cutting-edge designs for companies like NVIDIA or AMD, facing a technology lag of 2-3 generations. Other foundries including GlobalFoundries, UMC, and SMIC combined produce approximately 8-10 million wafers annually, mostly using mature nodes (28nm and above). These fabs lack the capability to produce advanced AI or mobile chips, making their technology unsuitable for the most critical applications. This significant gap highlights the limitations of alternative foundries in replacing TSMC's advanced manufacturing capacity.

In the best case, conflict resolves quickly within weeks with Fabs intact and the workforce returning, allowing recovery in 6-12 months. The moderate case involves TSMC being cut off from global markets with equipment shortages and brain drain, requiring 2-5 years and massive investment to recover. The worst case sees fabs and ASML equipment destroyed, key personnel lost, and a 7-10 year global rebuilding effort. In the first 1-3 years after, a global economic depression would occur with GDP losses of 3-5%, worse in tech-reliant economies (8-12%), and complete economic collapse in Taiwan. Industry impact includes 50-70% of fabless chip companies going bankrupt, a 40-60% shrinkage in automotive, 60-80% contraction in consumer electronics, and a major pause in AI development. This highlights Taiwan's semiconductor sector's vital role in the global economy and tech innovation.

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Technology Impact: Technology regression would mean existing devices keep working until they break, mature chips from other fabs (28nm+) are used, and refurbished chips help fill gaps. However, new AI, 5G/6G, next-gen gaming, advanced driver assistance, and cutting-edge computing would stall. The U.S. would likely respond with military action, a full economic war with China, a CHIPS Act expansion over \$500 billion, and massive fab building. China might gain TSMC assets but lose market access, cannot operate ASML equipment without Dutch cooperation, and faces heavy sanctions on its abs. Rebuilding globally over 7-10 years would cost \$2-3 trillion, adding about 20 million wafers of capacity led by expansions in the U.S., Europe, Japan, and South Korea.

Tech delays would include AI by 3-5 years, 6G by 5-7 years, autonomous vehicles by 5-10 years, and next-gen gaming/VR by 5+ years, with quantum computing slowed. Necessity would speed advances in chiplets, packaging, alternative computing, chip recycling, and mature node optimization.

What Accelerates (Out of Necessity): Out of necessity, chiplet architectures help bypass advanced node shortages by modularizing chip design, improving yields, and reducing costs. Advanced packaging, alternative computing like photonic and neuromorphic, chip recycling, and mature node optimization (28nm as "good enough") also accelerate due to supply constraints. Wildcard factors include TSMC's rumored "scorched earth" policy with self-destruct and remote kill switches on equipment to prevent China from benefiting if captured, prolonging recovery. The Netherlands' ASML controls EUV lithography and can remotely disable captured equipment, blocking China from producing sub-7nm chips, its strongest non-military leverage. Talent flight is critical: TSMC's top engineers flee to the US, Europe, and Japan, creating a brain drain. Operating fabs without their expertise is nearly impossible, and China cannot quickly replace this lost talent as expertise takes decades to build.

Long-term, the semiconductor world could follow three paths (10+ Years Out):

Scenario A: Successful diversification leads to global production of 30M+ wafers/year with no country dominating advanced chipmaking, stabilizing supply but at higher costs and resuming technology progress.

Scenario B: A bifurcated world splits into Western (US/Europe/Japan/Korea) with 25M wafers and Chinese-led bloc with 10M wafers of inferior tech, creating two incompatible ecosystems, higher costs, and slower innovation.

Scenario C: China gains control of captured TSMC assets, using chip leverage geopolitically and maintaining Western dependence, effectively acting as a "Chip OPEC" controlling the global tech supply.

If China invades Taiwan tomorrow, the world would face an economic catastrophe with a \$2 trillion global GDP loss in the first year, severe tech rationing, and massive inflation. Over 1-3 years, the tech sector would enter depression with 60-80% production losses. Recovery would be slow over 3-7 years, requiring \$2-3 trillion in investment, during which technological progress stagnates. By years 7-10, new capacity might come online, but with permanently higher costs and ongoing geopolitical fragility. Taiwan's semiconductor Fabs, especially TSMC, are more critical to global stability than many entire economies. Producing 17 million wafers yearly, these fabs form the unseen infrastructure of modern civilization. Preventing conflict and diversifying supply chains today is vastly more cost-effective, every dollar spent on deterrence saves \$100 later in crisis response. This underscores Taiwan's irreplaceable role in global technology and economic security.

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The World Forum

The World Forum is more than an annual summit. It questions the status quo, intends to disrupt conventional stagnation and aims to unite leaders from politics, civil society, and culture to engage in the ideas and practices for a better world through fundamental change. The World Forum serves as a platform where humankind's future is reshaped by elaborating new approaches, breakthrough ideas, technologies, investments and modern legislation, which pave the way for progress on tech, AI, social media, democracy, peace, justice, freedom, and the survival of the human race. In an era where advancements in AI and technology present unique opportunities but also existential threats, we intend to drive innovation, legislation, and initiate governing bodies, which are critical for society's democratic future, such as The World Council of Democratic Nations as well as The World Council on AI - Algorithms, social media and digital life.

A major topic is: How to reinvent democracy in the digital age? The Philosophers Panel discussed "Why Democracy" and not only how to protect the right to vote for every citizen, but also controversial ideas of giving educated voters, who can answer questions on the ballot correctly, more votes, as well as limitations of voting by constitutions, which may prevent an irrational "rule of the mob" as recent statistics confirm Plato's and Sigmund Freud's warning that 80-90% percent of humans can be manipulated to irrational decisions, harmful behaviour and voting. "Plato warned us that democracy has problems because people largely are irrational and they can easily be persuaded and manipulated by demagogues who give them false appearances." If democracy shall work, the division of powers and universal human rights must be guaranteed by the constitution as well as an alert society with democratic discourse in daily life and media. Nobel laureate Maria Ressa sees social media as a crucial element: "Without (proven) facts, there is no truth. Without truth, there is no democracy."

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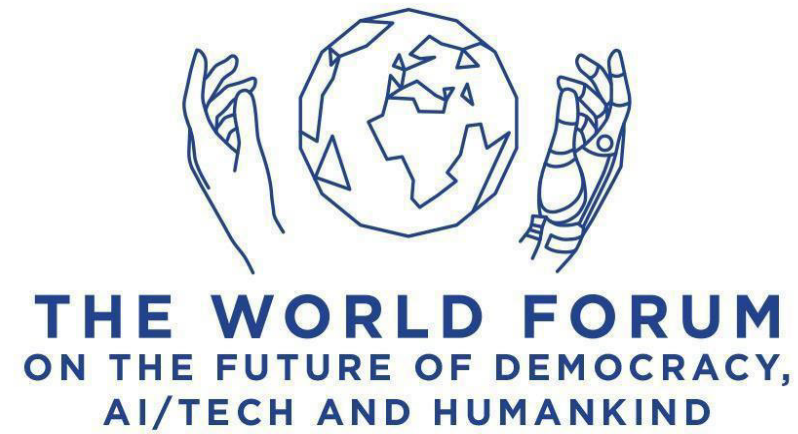
